ROLE OVERVIEW

We are seeking an outdoor educator to coordinate and implement logistics for diverse Alaska teens and teachers. If you are interested in the behind-the-scenes logistics required for implementing expedition-based programs, thrives on the detailed intricacies of program and expedition facilitation, possesses a sharp eye for risk management, and finds fulfillment in student engagement, then this position may be a great fit for you. This role ensures smooth program execution and has the opportunity to lead 1-2 courses throughout the summer.

CORE RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Implement and oversee logistics for Anchorage-based education programs including but not limited to: organizing pre- and post-trip paperwork, planning menus and food shopping, driving trips to/from the field, communicating with students and their family to ensure trip preparedness, and co-facilitating pre-trip orientations.
- Co-lead 1-2 courses during the summer.
- Oversee and maintain trip gear and gear warehouse. Assist in basic maintenance and upkeep of facilities.
- Provide transportation for programs, driving a 15-passenger van with a trailer in various road conditions between Anchorage, Whittier, and Denali.
- Participate in the risk management on-call team, rotating with other full-time Education staff to ensure we have Anchorage-based 24-7 phone support for trips in the field.
- Assemble comprehensive trip folders which includes student paperwork, emergency action plans, itineraries, maps/resources, and contingency plans.
- Provide effective and clear communication to Trip Leaders and Education staff.
- Maintain positive relationships with students and their families to establish a long-term connection to outdoor recreational pursuits on public lands.
- Communicate and model company standards and policies as stated in the Employee Manual.
- Internal alignment with the AK Geo mission and developing a culture of inclusion within the organization.
- Maintain a clean driving record.



QUALIFICATIONS:

- 21+ years old.
- Active Wilderness First Aid required, WFR strongly preferred.
- Must have a valid driver's license and clean driving record.
- Evening and weekend availability May-early August
- Excellent writing and verbal communication skills.
- General understanding of expedition programming, preferably 1+ season working in outdoor education/recreation or adventure tourism/guiding.
- Proactively and independently solve problems quickly and implement solutions.
- Experience with independent decision making in a professional environment.
- Excellent organization and time management skills. Ability to organize, prioritize, and efficiently complete diverse tasks while tracking many details.
- Knowledge of Alaska's natural history, Alaska Native cultures, general understanding of federal public lands, in particular areas of program operations, is preferred.
- Strong preference given to Alaska-based candidates.
- Must live in the immediate Anchorage area. Housing and transportation are not provided.
- A federal background check is required for this position.
- Must be able to lift 60 pounds regularly and throughout the day
- Must be legally authorized to work in the U.S.
